HOW DO WE PUT WHAT WE KNOW ABOUT CANINE OSTEOARTHRITIS ALL TOGETHER?

SIGNS TO LOOK FOR IN YOUR DOG AND THE CHALLENGES IN SPOTTING THEM

Identifying that your dog may have arthritis is not easy. Dogs are amazing at coping with pain and we are conditioned into believing the primary changes that serve as early indicators are simply a normal part of aging.

Indicators of pain can be physical, such as appearing stiff after walks, slowing down on walks, sitting differently or adaptations in body shape and coat. They may also be emotional, demonstrating as behaviour changes, such as becoming more

We all know our pets inside and out but sometimes pinpointing the issue, or expressing what we've observed that has led to our concern can be really difficult!

To help owners confidently confirm their suspicions of pain, or simply identify those changes that result in us as pet owners feeling 'He/She is just not right' CAM has created the following diagram.
